Camp Crosley YMCA is a place where we strive to create a community of values to nurture the growth and development of all of our campers. The following are guidelines for each of our values (please read through them with your camper and make sure he/she understands).

Caring: Because we care about others, are sensitive to their well-being, and helpful to other always be sensitive to the feelings of others. We do not tolerate bullying, intimidation, harassment, or conduct or statements that demean others. Campers are urged to report any instances to their cabin counselor, nurse, program director, or camp director. Never resort to fighting to settle a dispute.

Honesty: Because we are honest, trustworthy, have integrity, and make sure our choices match our values always tell the truth. Choose appropriate activities and use appropriate language-no swearing. Theft will not be tolerated. Turn found items in to your counselor so they can be returned to their owner.

Respect: Because we have respect, treat others as we want to be treated, and value ourselves and others always given attention to others and keep out of others' spaces. Your cabin is your home for your session. Campers are not to go into cabins that are not their own or into any other buildings without their counselor and another camper. When a leader is up front and raises his or her hand, everybody does the same and quiets down to hear the announcement. Never use booing to express your opinion.

Responsibility: Because we are responsible, do what is right, and are accountable for our behavior and obligations follow all safety rules. Campers must always be with at least one counselor and one other camper at all times. Always use sunscreen when you are out in the sun. Wear long pants and use bug spray in the evening. Know what to do in an emergency-move quickly to the Dining Hall with your cabin and await further instructions. To help keep camp beautiful, do not mark or deface camp buildings or nature and help with cabin clean up. No gum. Do not litter. Keep track of all of your belongings-make sure to check lost and found for any items you think you may have lost.

I understand that camp activities involve some inherent risks that can be minimized but not eliminated through preparation and instruction. I understand that there is no way to completely guarantee safety. If my child is old enough to participate, I give permission for them to participate in all camp activities including but not limited to horseback riding, ropes course, riflery, waterskiing/wakeboarding, and tubing. (While your camper may not have signed up for the above classes, they may get the opportunity to participate.)
